Subject: Govt. employees and the members of their family take treatment from any hospital recognized by the State Government/CGHS/CS (MA) Rules-regarding

Sir,

I am to refer to the subject cited above and to state that references have been received by this office as to whether Govt./KVS employees covered under CS(MA)Rules can avail treatment from Hospitals recognized under CGHS Scheme. In this connection, it is informed that the orders issued by the Govt. of India Ministry of Health and family welfare vide OM No. S.14025/7/2000-MS, dt 28th March, 2000 and No.S.14021/06/2005-MS dt. 4th January, 2007 were already circulated to all the Units of the Sangathan for reference & further action vide KVS letter No.161-3/99-2000/KVS/Budget dt.26.7.2000 and Letter No.125-21/2006-07/KVS (Budget) dt.22.5.2007 (copy enclosed). GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES/MEMBERS OF THEIR FAMILIES MAY TAKE TREATMENT FROM ANY HOSPITALS RECOGNIZED UNDER CGHS.

The undersigned is directed to say that the issue for grant of permission for treatment of Central Government employees and the members of their family in any of the hospitals recognized by the State Government/CGHS Rules/CS(MA) Rules, 1944, had been under consideration of the Government for some time past. It has now been decided that the Central Government employees and the members of their families may be permitted to avail of medical facilities in any of the Central Government, State Government Hospitals and the hospitals recognized by the State Government/CGHS Rules/CS(MA) Rules, 1944, as well as the hospitals fully funded by either Central Government or the State Government subject to the condition that they will be reimbursed the medical expenditure at the rates fixed by the Government under the CGHS Rules/CS(MA) Rules, 1944 or the actual expenditure incurred, whichever is less. In other words the permission can be granted by the Head of the Ministry/Department/Office to the Central Government employees/members of their families to obtain medical services from any of the private hospitals recognized under, CGHS in the 18 CGHS covered cities also.

2. If the treatment for a particular disease/procedure is available in the same city where the Government servant is employed, he may be permitted to avail of the medical services in any other city of his choice but in such cases, he will not be eligible for sanction of TA/DA. In case the treatment for a particular disease/procedure is not available at the same station, the beneficiary will be eligible for sanction of TA of his entitled class for taking treatment in a different city.

3. These orders will be effective from the date of issue.

4. This issues with the concurrence of Finance Division vide their Dy. No. 757/2000-JS & FA(H), dated 15/02/2000.

SCHEDULE OF RATES FOR THE TREATMENT IN LAKSHMI HOSPITAL, ERNAKULAM, COCHIN, ENHANCED BY 15%.

The undersigned is directed to refer to the letter, dated 25/06/1998 from the Lakshmi Hospital, Ernakulam, Cochin, for revision of the existing rates for the treatment of Central Government employees in their hospital and to say that the Government has approved upward revision of rates by 15% for the different types of treatments/procedures from the rates being charged by the hospital at present, which were fixed as per schedule of rates for Gautham Hospital, Kochi and Indira Gandhi Co-operative Hospital, Cochin.

2. The authorities of the Lakshmi Hospital, Ernakulam, Cochin, will have to enter into an agreement with the Government of India to the effect that the hospital will charge the Central Government employees at the rates fixed by the Government and they will have to sign a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) within a period of 3 months from the date of issue of the above-mentioned OM, failing which the Hospital may be derecognized. A copy of the MoU is enclosed.

This issues with the concurrence of the Finance Division vide their Dy. No. 4623/99 JS & FA, dated 6/09/1999.

**VAIDYARATNAM NURSING HOME, OLLUR THAIKATTUSSERY, THRISSUR,
KERALA, RECOGNIZED UNDER CS (MA) RULES, 1944.**

The undersigned is directed to say that it has been decided to recognize the Vaidyaratnam Nursing Home, Ollur Thaikattussery, Thrissur, Kerala, under Rule 2(c) of the CS (MA) Rules, 1944, for the treatment of Central Government employees and the members of their family. Since Ayurvedic hospitals specialized in Panchakarma Therapy are very few and also in consideration of the long waiting period for admission to the one already recognized, admission to this referral Nursing Home will be governed by the referral procedures laid down in CS(MA) Rules/CGHS Rules. Availing of direct consultations and OPD facilities from this Nursing Home are required to be prohibited strictly. The Nursing Home at Ollur, Kerala, is recognized for both types of beneficiaries covered under CS(MA) Rules, 1944 and CGHS for Panchakarma treatment. The rates of different procedures of the Nursing Home will be regulated as per the schedule of charges as mentioned in the rates of Kottakkal Arya Vaillyassala which is a reputed hospital already recognized under CS(MA) Rules, 1944.

2. The authorities of the Vaidyaratnam Nursing Home, Ollur Thaikattussery, Thrissur, Kerala, will have to enter into an agreement with the Government of India to the effect that the Nursing Home will charge the Central Government employees at par with the rates fixed for Kottakkal Arya Vaillyassala, Kerala and they will have to sign a Memorandum of Undertaking (MoU) within a period of 3 months from the date of issue of the above-mentioned OM, failing which the hospital will be derecognized. Subject to above, the hospital can start treating Central Government employees covered under CS (MA) Rules, 1944.

3. This issues with the concurrence of the JS (FA) vide his Dy. No. 903/2000-JS(FA) (Health), dated 24/02/2000.

4. In so far as persons serving in the Indian Audit and Accounts Department are concerned, this issues with the concurrence of the Office of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India vide their U.O. No. 95-Audit (Rules) 16-99. dated 19/04/2000.

Hospitals recognized by the State Governments/ CGHS/ CS (MA) Rules, 1944 – Grant of permission for treatment in any of the hospitals

The undersigned is directed to refer to this Ministry's O.M. No. S.14025/7/2000-MS, dated 28.3.2000, on the subject mentioned above in which a decision was communicated that the Central Government employees and the members of their families may be permitted to avail of medial facilities in any of the Central Government, State Government hospitals and the hospitals recognized by the State Government/ CGHS Rules/ CS (MA) Rules, 1944 subject to the condition that they will be reimbursed the medical expenditure at the rates fixed by the Government under the CGHS Rules/ CS (MA) Rules, 1944 or the actual expenditure, whichever is less. In other words, the permission can be granted by the Head of the Ministry/ Department/ Office to the Central Government employees/ members of their families to obtain medical services from any of the private hospitals recognized under CGHS in the 24 CGHS covered cities. In view of this decision, there is no objection if the Central Government employees also undertake medical treatment in any of the Hospitals for the procedures for which the hospitals are already recognized by the concerned State Governments.

2. The admissibility of reimbursement claims in such cases shall however, no doubt be subject to the condition laid down in Note 2 of Col. 8 (II) "Hospital Treatment" of Form Medical 97 relating to furnishing of the requisite certificate by Authorized Medical Attendant concerned that the requisite treatment was not available in any nearest Government Hospital.
